*It's NOT a professional service – it is people helping people



DOCTORS AND TIMEBANKING

- 1.2 million chronically lonely older people in the UK
- By 2039 people living alone will be around 10.7 million
- A Doctor said that half his patients need 'people not pills'
- UK has a social care crisis
- The NHS is in a critical state trying to care for so many
- GP's contacting Timebanking UK for help
- New model of timebanking being created
- Paxton Green Time Bank impact and savings to health service



MANY MEASURES OF IMPACT

- Cambridgeshire time banks
 - $\checkmark\,$ Reduction in social exclusion
 - $\checkmark\,$ Reductions in antisocial behaviour and crime
 - ✓ Greater safety (actual and/or perceived)
 - ✓ Social engagement
 - ✓ Citizen participation
 - \checkmark Improved housing and physical environments
 - \checkmark Increased levels of support to people who want to move into employment
 - $\checkmark\,$ Cost savings to public budgets
 - ✓ Improved health.

PAXTON GREEN TIME BANK IMPACT

- Time Bank started by a doctor for his 'heart sink' patients
- Focus on people living with depression (big issue for lonely people)

 \checkmark 76% of people agreed that timebanking lifted their mood

- \checkmark 67% said it had helped reduce their loneliness
- \checkmark 71% of those previously reporting depression felt it had improved depression \checkmark 83% agreed it had helped them make new friends



HOW DOES TIMEBANKING IMPACT ON PEOPLE?

BARNET TIME BANK, LONDON

47 time bank members interviewed after at least 6 months of joining



- 85% feel more valued as a member of the community as they are able to help others
- 85% felt able to ask for help from services that they may not be eligible for or to access themselves
- 77% feel fitter and happier than I used to since joining the time bank as I have less opportunity to sit at home by myself

UK timebanking is 21 years old in July 2019

- 268 time banks
- 17,000 people currently swapping time
- 43,500 people historically
- 3,000 organisations swapping time
- 5.5 million hours

266,290 hours swapped a year

Equal to over £2 million of paid labour every year

Time banking - help others and help yourself at the same time

Fancy spending an hour washing someone's car, doing some housework or gardening for them – and then getting that hour back from somebody else in a way that helps you? If so, time banking could be for you.

Time banking is growing nationally and can give you the chance to help others and help yourself at the same time. For every hour of time you give helping someone in your community you receive one time credit. You can then 'spend' that time credit when you need help from someone else. Best of all there is no regular commitment – you can choose when you get involved and gain time credits.


