...well-being. Kids need play as a part of their every day school lives.


METHODS: Surveyed -


- 1. 27 teachers of Pre-K through 3rd grade
- 2. 59 parents of children in grades Pre-K-3
- 3. 18 children in grades Pre-K-3

RESULTS:


- <u>Teachers</u> suggested kids should have about **71.85** minutes of play time per school day.
- Parents suggested 81.18 minutes.


Motivation

• U.S. has one of the lowest amounts *in the world* of time per day allotted for play for children ages 6-13.


<u>Participants</u>

- 27 Teachers: 2 Pre-K, 5 K, 9 1st grade, 3 2nd grade, 6 3rd grade, and 2 who did not specify their grade level
- 59 Parents: 14 Pre-K, 11 K, 4 1st grade, 11 2nd grade, 19 3rd grade
- 18 Children (10 M): 2 Pre-K, 1 K, 2 1st grade, 7
 2nd grade, 6 3rd grade

Teacher Ratings of the Importance of Play in Daily Education




Parent Ratings of the Importance of Play in Daily Education




- Parents' suggested minutes of play per day did differ by age group: 132.7 min for Pre-K, 76.75 min for K, 63.75 min for 1st grade, 71.75 min for 2nd grade, 54.21 min for 3rd grade
- Given enough time to play?
- Avg agreement among parents (out of 6) = 4.47;
 most grades around 4, but Pre-K avg = 5.29
- Kids: 44.4% yes, 55.6% want more
- Kids' reasons why they like to play at school:
 - Play with friends (100%)
- Break from school work (83.3%)
- Pay better attention after play (44.4%)
- Learn when play (38.9%)
- Makes learning more interesting (27.8%)
- 1 kid: "Allows you to feel like you can make the
- rules and can do whatever you want"

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




Teacher Ratings of the Importance of Play in Daily Education
